1. Advanced Academic Collocations (Essential for Writing Task 2)

Technology Impact Collocations

- **profound impact** - a deep, significant effect
 - *Example:* "Social media has had a profound impact on interpersonal communication skills among adolescents."
- **unprecedented access** - access that has never occurred or existed before
 - *Example:* "These platforms provide unprecedented access to information, regardless of geographical boundaries."
- **pervasive influence** - influence that spreads widely throughout an area or group
 - *Example:* "The pervasive influence of social networking sites on youth culture cannot be overstated."
- **facilitate interaction** - to make interaction possible or easier
 - *Example:* "Modern technology facilitates interaction between people who might otherwise never connect."

Society and Media Collocations

- **foster relationships** - to encourage or promote the development of relationships
 - *Example:* "Online communities can foster relationships between like-minded individuals worldwide."
- **disseminate information** - to spread information widely
 - *Example:* "Social media platforms enable users to rapidly disseminate information during crisis situations."
- **cultivate an online presence** - to develop and maintain a visible profile online

- *Example:* "Many professionals actively cultivate an online presence to enhance their career prospects."
- **perpetuate stereotypes** - to make stereotypes continue indefinitely
 - *Example:* "Certain content on social networks may inadvertently perpetuate stereotypes about minority groups."

Privacy and Security Collocations

- **compromise privacy** - to expose or make vulnerable one's personal information
 - *Example:* "The default settings on many platforms compromise privacy without users' informed consent."
- **implement safeguards** - to put protective measures into place
 - *Example:* "Tech companies must implement safeguards to protect user data from potential breaches."
- **mitigate risks** - to make risks less severe or serious
 - *Example:* "Digital literacy education helps mitigate risks associated with online activities."

2. Phrasal Verbs for Technology Contexts (Essential for Speaking Parts 2 & 3)

Connection Phrasal Verbs

- **log on/in** - to access a computer system or platform by entering username and password
 - *Example:* "Many users log on to multiple social media platforms several times daily."
- **sign up for** - to register for a service or account
 - *Example:* "The website encourages visitors to sign up for their newsletter to receive updates."
- **reach out to** - to contact someone, especially for help or support
 - *Example:* "Businesses increasingly reach out to customers through various social channels."
- **cut off from** - to be isolated or disconnected from
 - *Example:* "During the power outage, residents were completely cut off from their online networks."

Content Management Phrasal Verbs

- **scroll through** - to move through digital content by sliding it up, down, or sideways
 - *Example:* "Users often mindlessly scroll through their feeds without engaging deeply with the content."
- **back up** - to make a copy of digital information for safety
 - *Example:* "It's essential to back up your content before deleting accounts or changing platforms."

- **filter out** - to remove unwanted elements
 - *Example:* "Advanced algorithms filter out potentially offensive content before it appears in users' feeds."
- **opt out of** - to choose not to participate in something
 - *Example:* "Privacy-conscious users may opt out of data collection practices where possible."

Online Behavior Phrasal Verbs

- **show off** - to display proudly, often to impress others
 - *Example:* "Social media provides endless opportunities for users to show off their accomplishments."
- **keep up with** - to stay informed about or maintain the same level as others
 - *Example:* "Many people feel pressured to keep up with social trends displayed in their feeds."
- **break off** - to end a relationship or connection
 - *Example:* "Some individuals break off digital connections with former friends by 'unfriending' them."

Digital Communication Idioms

- **be/stay in the loop** - to be/remain informed about something
 - *Example:* "Social media helps distant family members stay in the loop about each other's lives."
- **put yourself out there** - to make yourself visible and available to others
 - *Example:* "Dating apps require users to put themselves out there in ways that can feel uncomfortable."
- **at your fingertips** - immediately accessible
 - *Example:* "Smartphones put global communication at your fingertips 24 hours a day."

Online Trends Idioms

- **go viral** - to spread rapidly through social sharing
 - *Example:* "Marketing teams try to create content that will go viral and reach millions of potential customers."
- **jump on the bandwagon** - to join an activity that has become popular
 - *Example:* "Many businesses jumped on the TikTok bandwagon once they saw its marketing potential."
- **a flash in the pan** - something that attracts attention but doesn't last

- *Example:* "Some social media platforms proved to be just a flash in the pan, while others have endured."

Technology Impact Idioms

- **a double-edged sword** - something with both positive and negative aspects
 - *Example:* "Social media is a double-edged sword, connecting people but potentially increasing feelings of isolation."
- **a digital detox** - a period when someone stops using digital devices
 - *Example:* "Many users periodically undertake a digital detox to improve their mental wellbeing."
- **fall down a rabbit hole** - to become completely absorbed in something, often wasting time
 - *Example:* "It's easy to fall down a rabbit hole when browsing video content, spending hours unintentionally."

- **technological determinism** - the theory that technology drives the development of social structure and cultural values

 - *Example:* "Many users remain unaware of the extent of their digital footprint across various platforms."
- **algorithmic bias** - when an algorithm reflects or amplifies existing prejudices
 - *Example:* "Research increasingly reveals algorithmic bias in content recommendation systems."

- **echo chamber** - an environment where a person only encounters beliefs or opinions that coincide with their own
 - *Example:* "Social media platforms can create echo chambers that reinforce existing beliefs and limit exposure to diverse perspectives."
- **digital divide** - the gap between demographics that have access to modern technology and those that don't

- *Example:* "Despite widespread adoption, the digital divide continues to exclude certain populations from full participation."
- **cyberbullying** - the use of electronic communication to bully a person
 - *Example:* "Educational institutions increasingly implement policies to address cyberbullying on social platforms."

"While social media platforms **facilitate interaction** across geographical boundaries, they simultaneously contribute to creating **echo chambers** where users encounter only opinions that align with their existing beliefs. This **pervasive influence** of algorithmic content selection may **compromise** the development of critical thinking skills among younger users..."

Speaking Part 3 Sample Response

"I believe the relationship between social media and traditional journalism is evolving rapidly. News organizations have had to **jump on the bandwagon** of digital distribution to remain relevant. While this has enabled them to **disseminate information** more widely, it has also created pressure to publish quickly, sometimes before facts are verified.
